It is with much sadness that we must announce that Erin Akemi Enomoto Moore passed away on Monday, May 27th, at the age of 47, after a six-month battle with Stage IV Colon Cancer. Erin grew up in Half Moon Bay, California, the daughter of Ron and Nancy Yano Enomoto. She graduated from the University of California Davis in 1994, where she was an active member of Kappa Alpha Theta. At UC Davis, Erin met her husband, Gerald “Jerry” Moore.
