Frances Alexander Wardlaw, 92 of Marietta, GA passed away May 25, 2020. Due to the current restrictions on social gatherings the family will hold a private graveside service on Wednesday.

Frances was born October 14, 1927 in a farmhouse on Dallas Highway in Marietta. She lived with her parents and five older brothers and sisters. Frances and her family attended New Salem Baptist Church.
