



## Patrick A. Dolan

June 9, 1924 - June 14, 2016

Patrick A. Dolan of Austell, Georgia, formerly of Indianapolis, retired radiologist, age 92, died peacefully on June 14, 2016. A memorial service will be at St. Luke Catholic Church in Indianapolis, at 11:30 a.m. on Saturday, June 18, 2016. There will be no calling.

Born in Stamford, Lincolnshire, England, he was educated in Canada, and served in the Royal Canadian Air Force as both Aircrew and Medical Officer during and after World War II. He was on the medical staffs of Baylor University and The University of Texas Medical Schools in Houston, Texas before coming to Indianapolis in 1962. He was the founding member of the Radiologic Specialists of Indiana. For 29 years he was on the Medical Staff of Methodist Hospital, and served as Director of Radiologic Services for more than 16 years. He was also Associate Clinical Professor at I.U. School of Medicine. In addition, he was a Fellow of the American College of Radiology and the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada.

During his career Dr. Dolan was active in his professional societies and his posts included presidency of the Indiana Roentgen Society and the Radiologic Section of the Indiana State Medical Association.

Dr. Dolan is survived by his wife, Shirley, sons Patrick A. Dolan, Jr, spouse Lori, of Iowa City, Iowa; Kevin G. Dolan, spouse Debbie, of Marietta, Georgia; Maureen J. Pearson, spouse Skip, of West Bloomfield, Michigan; and Erin C. Randle, spouse John, of Durango, Colorado. He is also survived by his sister C. Frances Dolan, Victoria, B.C., Canada, nine beloved grandchildren, and many beloved nieces and nephews.
