



Dr. Stanley R. Wrinkle

November 5, 1942 - November 2, 2017

Stanley Wrinkle, age 74, of Acworth, GA, passed away Thursday, November 2, 2017. A Memorial Service will be held at 2 pm on Saturday, November 11 at Mayes Ward-Dobbins Macland Chapel, Powder Springs with Rev. Charles Sineath, Rev. Johnny Foster and Dr. Nelson Price officiating. The family will receive friends from 12 noon until the service at the funeral home. Burial will take place at Lynnhurst Cemetery in Knoxville, TN, at a later date.

A retired Cobb County Schools educator, Stanley (who was to turn 75 this month) retired after 18 years as assistant superintendent. His career began in 1964 as a teacher and coach at Marietta High School. He became a charter faculty member and football coach at Wheeler High School in 1965. After receiving his Ed.D. from the University of Tennessee in 1972, he served as principal at Sedalia Park Elementary and in 1975 became the first principal at Walton High School.

Retirement opened new opportunities to share his love of education. He served as an adjunct professor at Kennesaw State University; co-principal at the school at Roswell Street Baptist Church; member of the board at Mt. Paran Christian School in Kennesaw; and board member of Marietta Mentoring for Leadership at MHS. Stanley was a longtime member of First United Methodist Church of Marietta.

Stanley is preceded in death by his parents, Charles and Lillian Wrinkle, and sister, Cynthia Wrinkle; he is survived by his loving wife of 52 years, Kaydell Wrinkle of Acworth, GA; daughters: Kirsten (Dennis) Alongi of Marietta, GA; Jennifer (Kaz) Hasnani of Jasper, TN; brother Jerry (Pat) Wrinkle of Knoxville, TN; and 5 grandchildren: Matthew and Kaydee Alongi; Madison, Marissa and Mallory Hasnani. He will be greatly missed by his loving family, former football coaches, teammates and players, and a multitude of caring friends.

He was a good and conscientious teacher who seemed to honestly care about his students, and he had an interestingly idiosyncratic personality.
